BUDGET PLANNING

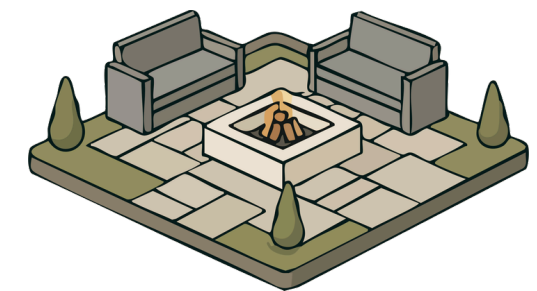
Typical outdoor living :

- Permit approval duration



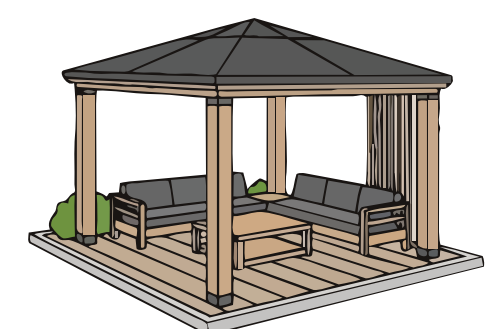
